Hope Horizon is a \$1.2MM non- profit serving close to 250 mostly at-risk and low-income youth each year in after-school and summer programs, using relational, holistic and collaborative approaches to empower the next generation of community leaders. About the Position:

The Hope Horizon East Palo Alto Executive Staff is seeking a Robotics VEX/FLL Coordinator that will lead VEX 123, GO, Lego League students and be the main representative of these programs to the greater East Palo Alto community. **The Robotics VEX/FLL** will also be responsible for working with the Program Team and Hope Horizon EPA volunteers to clearly guide the VEX 123, GO, Lego League students as they coach them in age specific, applicable robotics lessons.

The qualified candidate will be a competent classroom leader with a high level of integrity that has worked in a similar non-profit or ministry. They will have training or schooling in robotics, classroom development, and proper understanding of how to work with students in a classroom setting. This candidate will have knowledge of child development and will share

their skill set in an effective way with students. They will be mindful that they are a representative of Christ and of Hope Horizon EPA as they work within our community.

Key Responsibilities:

Vision & Strategy

- Oversee Hope Horizon EPA classrooms at their most essential levels.
- Carry out the mission of Hope Horizon East Palo Alto and the vision of its leadership while adhering to defined organizational values.

Fundraising & Community Relations

- In partnership with the Executive Staff and Development Officer support aspects of fundraising personal appointments, church and foundation presentations, grant applications, writing solicitation letters, fundraising events, etc.
- Promote Hope Horizon EPA in our community and in local organizational partners. This may include speaking in a variety of settings and representing the organization at public events.
- Utilize networks within local agencies, area churches, and similar ministries to reinforce and engage with Hope Horizon EPA elementary and middle school robotics.

Program Support and Responsibilities

- Supervise, train, and develop elementary robotics and middle school FLL volunteers in the functions of their roles.
- In collaboration with the Director of Programs, manage and maintain robotics budget.
- Supervise and assist elementary robotics and FLL students in completing their specific assignments and managing events and competitions.
- Work with elementary robotics and FLL students and support them.
- Complete other duties as assigned by Elementary Program Manager and Middle School Program Manager to meet the needs of elementary robotics and FLL.
- Develop Hope Horizon EPA robotics program plans and processes yearly.
- Onboard, train, supervise, and develop all program volunteers as they need to be supported within the functions of their role in the program.
- Work in conjunction with Hope Horizon EPA Volunteer Manager/Staff in order develop and sustain the program.
- Follow and maintain all Hope Horizon policies and procedures as they pertain to student safety and industry standards.

Required Qualifications

- Agreement with Statement of Faith and commitment to the mission of Hope Horizon EPA
- Satisfactory completion of a background check (including LiveScan, as appropriate), that may include, but is not limited to: criminal records check, verification of academic credentials, licenses, certificates, credit history, professional references and/or verification of work history is required for employment
- Work experience, including a focus on urban and multi-ethnic ministries with children
- Have a desire to help children improve their academic and social skills
- Some college courses completed

- Basic knowledge for robotics and/or engineering
- Persuasive and passionate communicator with strong written and verbal skills
- Strong work ethic with a high degree of energy, emotional intelligence, and excellent interpersonal skills
- High ethical standard and values
- Strong attention to detail, excellent organizational skills and an ability to work well under pressure
- Ability to work at conflict resolution, or be willing to learn, to maintain relationships within program staff and
 volunteers for the success of the programs and reputation of Hope Horizon East Palo Alto within the greater
 community
- Willingness to participate collaboratively, supportively, and enthusiastically on a diverse team
- Participate in ongoing trainings relevant to the job role

- Bilingual (Spanish)
- Experience working in a similar nonprofit
- Bachelor's degree in related field
- Strong familiarity with the East Palo Alto and Belle Haven communities
- Established networks with local churches, nonprofits and foundations is a plus
